Theme Days:

Reception Class Applications:

If your child's date of birth is between 01/09/2020 and 31/08/2021 then now is the time to apply for their Reception Class School.

Last Week of Autumn Term:

Wednesday 18th December 2024

Parents are invited into nursery for our Christmas "Rhyme Time". The start time for the morning session is 10:30am, and the afternoon session is 2:30pm. Entrance is via the garden gate, which will close at 10.40am and 2.40pm respectively. Please ensure you arrive on time, as late arrivals will not be admitted as it causes disruption for the children and other parents. This will last approx. 30 minutes. Parents of full-time children can choose either time. A reminder will be sent later in the year.

Thursday 19th December 2024

Santa and some of his elves will be visiting the children at Nursery. There will be a Winter Wonderland to visit, including some 'snowy' animals and each child will receive a gift.

Friday 20th December 2024

Last day of our Autumn Term and the day of our Christmas Party.

To allow the staff to complete home visits for the new children starting in January, and so that we don't have to close the school to facilitate this, we will be altering the session times on this day. Details to follow in the next newsletter

Attendance Reminder:

All absences must be reported to the <u>school office only</u>. Any non-reported absences will be recorded as 'unauthorised'. If unwell, please advise the nature of the illness — not just 'unwell'

If your child reaches 10 absence days during a school year (Sept to Jul) the School Business Manager will send you an email letting you know. If your child reaches 15 absence days, a meeting will be set up with your child's keyworker. The nursery reserves the right to terminate the Agreement and off-roll your child if absences (for any reason) of 20 days have accrued across the school year. This will be at the discretion of the Head teacher.

If you arrive after the school gate has closed at 8:45am or 12:45pm, you will need to bring your child in through the school reception. A 'late' mark will be recorded and you will need to wait with your child until 9:00am or 1.00pm, before they can be taken through to the classroom.

If you are late to <u>collect</u> your child, we will record this, and if you hit 3 late collections, the school will issue you a £5 fine, as this is unfunded staffing time.

Children must be accompanied to and from Nursery by an adult. The Nursery only takes responsibility for the child when they have been handed to a member of staff at the classroom door. In the interest of your child's safety, we ask that you let the

Nursery staff know whenever anyone other than yourself is going to collect your child.

Please note: If the person collecting your child looks younger than 16, we will need to see proof of date of birth – Please understand, this is for safeguarding reasons.

Outside Play:

One common question that we hear from parents is 'are the children going outside if it is cold?'.

The common belief is that children will not like being outdoors or will get sick being outdoors in the cold. Playing outside is so important for learning and has so many different opportunities for exploration. It is very important for early childhood development. Sickness is caused by a viral or bacterial infection. When children go outside, they are less likely to get sick since they are out in the open fresh air with an abundance of Vitamin D. Viruses are transmitted by direct contact, and children share toys, hug each other and touch each other, so the chance to spread infection is higher indoors than outdoors due to the type of activities they engage in and the equipment used.

Please do not ask us to keep your child inside during the Nursery session.

propriate Clothing:

climbing, running, rolling, sitting, jumping. Dresses, jeans, shirts, Crocs, flip flops etc. are not suitable for these activities. The children need to be dressed comfortably. Suitable clothing items are tracksuits, leggings, trainers.

Children also need to dress appropriately for the changing weather. We will be going outside <u>WHATEVER</u> the weather. This means if it is raining, your child needs to be wearing a coat.

A reminder – we have Regatta waterproof suits available to purchase from the school office for £10 $\,$
